BIOGRAPHY

I immigrated to the United States of America from the Cooperative Republic of Guyana, South America in 1977, the continent's only English-speaking country located on the coast of the Atlantic Ocean bordered by Venezuela to the west, Brazil to the west and south, and Suriname to the East. I spent my formative years in the inner cities of East New York, Flatbush, and Crown Heights, Brooklyn, NY, and grew up in the low-income public housing apartments of Louis H. Pink Houses. My dad worked at the Bank of New York while completing his Marketing degree at Bernard M. Baruch College. My mom worked nights at the same bank. We did not

have much in material possession, but we came to the United States determined to succeed. I attended the Academy for the Performing Arts at Erasmus Hall High School, where I majored in Theatre, and was active in championship football and track. I later attended Medgar Evers College pursuing a degree in Political Science and Economics. While attending college, I worked on Wall Street for Chase Manhattan Bank and later, Stone and Webster Engineering, acquiring administrative experiences that would serve me well later in life. In 1992, I relocated to Lithonia Georgia and established a Desktop Publishing and Typesetting business and also worked several contract assignments to supplement my entrepreneurial endeavors.

I am a graduate of DeVry University (formerly DeVry Institute of Technology) with undergraduate degrees in Electronic Engineering Technology and Telecommunications Management. I received my MBA and Master of Project Management with distinction from Keller Graduate School of Management in 2005. I worked for 17 years as a Regulatory Compliance EMC/EMI Electronic and Project Engineer, and the past 6.5 years in business development, project management, and client relations. In 2007, I established Thompson Management Consulting, LLC to assist entrepreneurs and small business owners develop business plans, and the business has grown into a comprehensive management consulting operation. I also work in advocacy for businesses designated as disadvantaged entities. From 2012 - 2019, I planned and executed an annual Entrepreneurship and Small Business Summit (ESBS) which invited top consultants from around the Metro Atlanta area to participate as workshop facilitators, panelists, and keynote speakers. The event, held during National Small Business Week, attracted anywhere from 100-150 attendees each year. In addition, I taught business courses as an Adjunct Professor at Shorter University, in the College of Adult and Professional Programs.

My current community involvement includes mentoring, youth symposium planning, advocacy for seniors and veterans, and past executive duties for the Guyana Association of Georgia (GAOG). I am currently an Advisory Board member for the Clyde L. Strickland Center for Entrepreneurship at Discovery High School where I judge shark tank competitions and mentor students on developing businesses, as well as an occasional mentor for the business program lead by Rod Hames at Crews Middle School. I am an author, publishing *A Brand New You: Taking Ownership of Your Personal Brand* in 2010. In my spare time, I enjoy reading, listening to music, traveling, professional networking, public and keynote speaking and conducting random business and economic research.

- **Engagement (Continued Goal)**
 - Continue with Coffee with Councilman Thompson, 2 Saturdays of each month
 - Specially planned events for constituents/stakeholders

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- Continue to work with organizations such as Gwinnett Housing Authority, Gwinnett Entrepreneur Center, local non-profits, and others for community engagement. Build closer relationships.

- **Economic Growth and Development (Continued Goal)**

- Increase visibility of Lawrenceville to new markets and opportunities
- Work with city leaders to identify new access to funding opportunities for specially developed projects
- Capturing traffic/attention from incoming flights to Briscoe Airport

Note: *This includes continued engagement with Briscoe Airport to leverage airport traffic and passengers flying into Lawrenceville. There is potential revenue to capture for area restaurants, the Aurora Theater/LAC, the hotel, tourist attractions, and retail outlets.*

- **Entrepreneurship and Small Business Support (Continued Goal)**

- Continued work to promote opportunities for entrepreneurs in our city, such as Doing Business with the City of Lawrenceville during National Small Business Week, and additional presentation I coordinate with the Gwinnett Entrepreneur center for small business owners.
- Strengthen my advocacy for ALL small businesses in our city, especially those outside the DTL who desire greater support from the city.
- Work with state lawmakers to identify access to capital for micro and SME's, especially minority-owned businesses and those classified as disadvantaged.
- Increase a pathway to minority contracting for contractors
- Work with the Small Business Development Center (SBDC), Small Business Administration (SBA), Lawrenceville Business Alliance (LBA), and area chambers to support our local small business ecosystem

- **Safety, Security, and Quality of Life (Continued Goal)**
 - Continue to work closely with our Police Chief to ensure ongoing security and protection for our businesses and residents
 - Work with city leaders to ensure proper and safe infrastructure, lights, storm water systems, lights, and sanitation meets the expectations of our residents and businesses
 - Continued support to reduce blight and slum lord neglect in our city

- **Livable Wage Job Creation Plan (Continued Goal)**
 - With support from city leaders, encourage companies to relocate their operations to Lawrenceville (I.e. higher wage employment opportunities)
 - Present plans to establish a tech village/district in Lawrenceville. This will be a great opportunity to establish a medical technology corridor that works with Northside Gwinnett, much like the driverless technology district in Norcross.

- **Affordable Housing Plans (Continued Goal)**
 - Support Councilwoman Taylor-Crawford’s plan for an ordinance advocating for housing developers to consider 10% affordability on each newly constructed housing project
 - Support the Lawrenceville/Gwinnett Housing Authority on the development of new affordable housing development projects and continued support to the Housing Fair.
 - Work on plans for a tiny/micro home community in our city (New goal)
 - Support for additional affordable 55+ and mixed income housing consideration

***Note:** Affordable housing is NOT low-income housing.*

- **Equal and Fair Access for All (Continued Goal)**
 - With DEI rollbacks and terminating segregation policy, ensure fair and equal employment for all candidates, fair and equal treatment for all current employees, fair and equal access to contractors, fair and equal treatment of our veterans, fair and equal treatment to all classified disadvantaged/minority groups and everything across the board in our city

- **Addressing Homelessness (Continued Goal)**
 - Collaborate with the Salvation Army, Lawrenceville Response Center (LRC), Family Promise, Latin American Association (LAA), and area Gwinnett County resources to plan and execute needed programs.
 - With these organizations, determine what is needed from the Council to assist in the work they already conduct.

- **Youth Leadership Development (New Goal – Middle and High School)**

- Plan to work with several schools within the city limits on youth summits and other development initiatives, capitalizing on what I started with National Engineer’s Week and the Business Academy at Discovery High School, and with Mr. Rod Hames’ business mentoring class at Crews Middle School. This initiative will include building a closer relationship with Georgia Gwinnett College (GGC) students, local churches, the Gwinnett District Attorney’s office, Lawrenceville Police Department, licensed area counselors, and other stakeholders.

As a substitute teacher in the Gwinnett County Public School system, I see where various programs could help support our 01 young scholars and amazing teachers.

Ancillary Plans:

- Establish a **Quarterly Constituent Roundtable** of community representatives/leaders to discuss opportunities in our neighborhoods. The roundtable will consist of one representative from each community area.

A task force (TF) shall be established for the following build a network of community advocacy:

1. **Community Enhancement TF:** A task force of a few residents from each neighborhood area to meet and discuss what the city can do to enhance the community’s quality of life. The committee will determine the frequency of our meetings and times.

Some topics for consideration are, but not limited to sanitation, parking (excessive vehicles), lighting, increasing walkable roads, traffic, safety, security, transportation, stormwater issues, and other concerns for consideration.

2. **Job Opportunities TF:** With rising unemployment and the lack of livable wage jobs, the purpose of this task force is to help identify opportunities for local Lawrenceville residents who are challenged with finding employment. Some considerations may include but not limited to job fairs (partnering with local entities to sponsor locations), working with local career agencies to foster partnerships for career opportunities and skills matching (i.e. Randstadt), and other related solutions-based options.

3. **Food Security/Community Food Banking TF:** The purpose of this committee is to work with local area food banks/pantries to keep the neighborhood informed of what food items are available. This task force may offer opportunities to deliver food items to the sick and shut in and to community neighbors who are unable to get to the food banks/pantries.
4. **Entrepreneurship & Innovation Support TF:** The purpose of this task force is to work with local agencies (the SBDC, SBA, etc) to determine possible support for local entrepreneurs. Support is described as, but not limited to funding (start-up and expansion), branding, marketing, grants, interns for open positions, help making making connection with area support organizations (i.e. Gwinnett Entrepreneur Center, local chambers, Lawrenceville Business Alliance, etc.)
5. **Special Events TF:** The purpose of this task force is to work with Councilman Thompson to organize and execute his special events, such as health fair, youth symposium and youth progrms (National Engineers Week), and other annual events.
6. **Homeless Advocacy TF:** The purpose of this task force is to work with area churches, the Salvation Army, Lawrenceville Co-Op, Street Wise, and other organizations to help connect homeless individuals with much needed resources.
7. **Youth Development TF:** Please refer to Youth Leadership Development above.

Objective:

Bring leaders together to foster unity, a sense of community, and best practices. This is an idea from my time served on the Lawrenceville Neighborhood Alliance (LNA) and other community organizations prior to serving on the Council.

- Quarterly ride-a-long with Code Enforcement

Objective:

Observe routes and opportunities for enhancements in our neighborhoods.

- Continued Advocacy for expanded micro transit services, especially if expansion passes. Areas in which Gwinnett micro transit has no service will require expansion consideration to serve residents.

Objective:

To ensure better connectivity between Lawrenceville, Lilburn, Snellville, and other new service areas. This will enhance transportation needs for riders to connect with job opportunities, shopping, and travel to other areas of Gwinnett and beyond. Also, increased shuttle service during peak times of the day.

- Support for quality of life for local military Veterans

Objective:

Ongoing information sessions and workshops to support our local veterans. Information will include but will not be limited to access to veterans' benefits and medical services, support for affordable housing, and for those who are homeless.

Engagement Philosophy

Continuous engagement of the people I serve is one of my fundamental beliefs as a community leader for relationship building. Engage, listen, offer conversation, mutually determine a solution, and be a representative to solve problems. I am about service to people who oftentimes feel marginalized and underserved. I focus on those who feel invisible and believe no one listens to them. For over 30 years, this has been my fundamental philosophy, a builder of natural relationships. Now, as an elected official in the City of Lawrenceville, I am able to vote on ordinances and set policies representing the interests of my constituents. **You are not invisible to me.** I am committed to those who have faith in me to be their representative, and with their trust, speak on their behalf at the seat of decision-making. This, I take very seriously. I am a representative of **ALL** 35,000 residents in our city and I will continue to carry each of you with me as I sit with my fellow elected municipal leaders to set policy for Lawrenceville. You and your concerns matter and every tax paying resident deserves to be represented fairly and equally. Thank you for your continued support..


